


# **Report on 'Florence Get-Together'**

asked for money for the Christmas dinner, Pat Miller made the motion to put up \$500. Bill Call 2nd and the motion passed.



## **Roseburg National Cemetery Appearance Gets Upgraded**

The federal government will carve out a 20-acre military cemetery from a golf course on the Roseburg Veterans Affairs Medical Center grounds and will also upgrade the appearance of the nearby Roseburg National Cemetery, according to the cemetery's director. The existing 4.5-acre national cemetery, established in 1897, has run out of room for caskets and can only accommodate cremated remains. The National Cemetery Administration has been planning the addition for several years, and construction could begin this fall.



#### Ex-Marine Who Wore Unearned Medals Barred From VA Hospital

The AP (9/10) reports, "Veterans Administration spokeswoman Cindy Butler told the North County Times on Thursday that David Weber's volunteer work had been terminated. The decision came after the American Combat Veterans of War complained that it was disrespectful to veterans to let Weber work at the hospital." The AP adds, "The 69-year-old former Marine staff sergeant was ordered to perform 240 hours of community service after pleading guilty in January to posing as a Marine general."



# **Veteran's family requests support for Patriot Guard Riders**

Frederick Brehony, a member of the Patriot Guard Riders, was on his motorcycle, on his way to honor a fallen Vietnam at Willamette National Cemetery, when he was killed instantly in a collision with a car on September 10, 2010.

Brehony, 67, was a retired meat cutter who held the rank of Yeoman 3rd Class in the U.S. Navy, and served on a destroyer during the Vietnam War.

Friends and family mourned his untimely passing, while requesting donations to the Patriot Guard Riders, whom he supported to the moment of his death.

The Patriot Guard Riders is a national group, internet-based, which provides motorcycle escorts and other ceremonial support for veterans, while they are alive or after their passing.

"Standing for those who stood for us," is the motto on their website forum (http://www.patriotguard.org). The group formed out of the impulse to show more honor to veterans, alive or dead, than our nation accorded to those who served in Vietnam.

The group works with families, casualty assistance officers, all branches of the military, funeral directors, and state and local police to arrange dramatic flag lines and to join funeral processions. They attend by family invitation only.

Patriot Guard Riders will rally to welcome homecoming soldiers, or to participate in veterans' funerals. Not infrequently, Riders have also served as human barriers, screening grieving friends and families from groups which demonstrate at military burials. One Kansas group, in particular, excercises their civil rights by picketing military funerals carryings signs saying "God Hates Fags," and Patriot Guard Riders have been able to minimize their impact while preserving their rights.
